


VICTIMS OF RAT POISON

Many different species of animals are affected, and even killed, by rodenticides. When rodents (not just rats) consume the poison, anticoagulants begin to slowly kill them through internal bleeding. It can take as long as a week, and in that time predators may prey on the poisoned rodent(s). The predator is then poisoned too, and this cycle can continue through the food chain.

THERE ARE NO SAFE POISONS! Sanitation and exclusion are the only real solutions to address and prevent rodent problems.
